This will feature as many of Paul's cars that are available plus many NZ Motor Racing Legends. We will have a hospitality suite available both weekend days so drivers can mix with the NZ legends. Classes racing are BMW 2 Litre, BMW E30 ,BMW Open, HMC/HSC, F5000, Formula Libre/FONZ/NZ Sports cars, Classic Trial, 2KCup, Historic Sports Sedans, Pre65/Mini, Tranzam, Trofeo, ERC and Classic Touring Cars.

Three of this seasons HRC meetings are honouring Motorsport heroes. Jack Nazer Classic at Taupo on 10th 11th April, Jamie Aislabie Meeting at Taupo on 1st 2nd May and of course the Paul Fahey Legends of Speed Meeting on 19th – 21st March at Hampton Downs.

The 2KCup fields are oversubscribed but at all rounds apart from the Legends of Speed there is an IPC round at the same meeting. 2K Cup cars are competitive in the IPC 3 class so competitors should enter the IPC class. As spots become available in the 2KCup class James can shift your entry on the day from IPC to 2KCup. This means you are assured of a start either in IPC or 2KCup.

HRC had a very successful meeting at Taupo on the 9<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> January. Spectators were also up at Taupo on what we had in previous years at Taupo. Interesting checking the log books. Some of the cars had not raced since 2015. Now that overseas trips are not possible perhaps funds are being diverted back to race cars! As was mentioned at drivers briefing HRC had combined some of the classes. This enables HRC to run more classes at our race meetings and that in turn means entry fees can be held at the present level even though costs seem to be always increasing. At a two day race meeting we can only run 10 to 11 classes and need an average class entry of about 25 cars to break even. It is no secret that classes that consistently run fields of about 35 to 40 cars do get a discount.

Another pleasing trend is drivers returning to the sport, HRC have seen a rising number of drivers reapplying for a race licence that has expired for over two years. They have

to re-sit the test which can be done at the HRC office Monday to Friday. Just ring and make an appointment.

Great to see HRC life member Kenny Smith competing in his 50<sup>th</sup> NZ Grand Prix. A record that is unlikely to be eclipsed. In the weekend Kenny drove very bravely in spite of still recovering from shoulder surgery. An inspiration to us all.

Planning for the Muriwai centenary celebrations is well under way for Friday 5<sup>th</sup> March. See article below for details.



FRIDAY 5<sup>th</sup> March 2021 at Muriwai Beach, Auckland. The New Zealand Motor Cup Centenary Celebrations



First New Zealand Motor Cup race, 1921



The first New Zealand Motor Cup race took place on Muriwai Beach, Auckland on 5th March 1921 and was a 25 mile drag race. The race was extended to 50 miles the following year (1922) and three turns were introduced for the benefit of the spectators. In 1923 the race length was 50 miles again but five turns were used.

The cup was won outright in 1928 (after 3 consecutive wins) by R B Wilson, ESQ who in 1953 donated it to New Zealand International Grand Prix Inc, on condition that it be competed for annually in the Auckland Grand Prix race under its original title.

The cup was won in its 100th year by Shane Van Gisbergen at the 2021 New Zealand Grand Prix held at Hampton Downs.

On 5<sup>th</sup> March 2021, HRC, MSNZ Historic Race Commission and NZIGP will be holding a celebration to commemorate 100 years since the first beach races and the awarding of the New Zealand Motor Cup. Come along and join us for brunch at this once in a century opportunity. There will be a turnout of historically significant vehicles on the beach along with static exhibits at the surf club including the 1921 winning Cadillac right through to the latest Toyota FT60. Many previous winners will also be in attendance and the New Zealand Motor Cup itself will be on display.





#### **COLLINS MAKES EVERY MOVE A WINNING ONE IN TAUPO HISTORIC GRAND PRIX RACE**

Category young gun Michael Collins (Leda GM1) made every move a winning one in the feature Taupo Historic Grand Prix trophy race at the second round of the 2020/21 SAS Autoparts MSC NZ F5000 Tasman Cup Revival motor racing series at the lakeside central North Island city's Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park today (Sunday Jan 24).

Behind the wheel of the Alistair and Vicki Hey-owned ex Graham McRae/Dexter Dunlop 1972 Tasman Cup/US L&M series-winning Leda GM1, Collins, 25, set the fastest race lap - a 1:28. 532- on his way to his second lights-to-flag victory at the fifth annual, this time Ford-supported, Taupo Historic GP meeting.

After qualifying comfortably quickest on Saturday morning defending SAS Autoparts/MSC Series title holder Collins won the first category race of the weekend in similar swash-buckling fashion on Saturday afternoon.

Not before he had been put under considerable early race pressure, however, by fellow young gun Codie Banks (Lola T332).

Banks, who qualified second quickest, pushed Collins hard for the first four laps of the first (8 lap) race before being slowed by a gear selection issue and ending his charge in the pits.

His luck didn't get any better on Sunday either, pulling out of the second SAS Autoparts MSC series race on Sunday morning before it had even started thanks to an engine issue then being forced to sit out the final race when the problem turned out to be terminal.

That left Kevin Ingram and fellow Lola T332 driver Brett Willis to pick up the pieces and claim the final podium places in both the first and final class races.

Former SAS Autoparts MSC Series title holder Willis did particularly well to get up to third place in the 10-lap Taupo Historic GP Trophy final, after being tipped into a half spin as the field entered the first corner on the opening lap.

Michael Collins' older sister Anna Collins driving the other Alistair and Vicki Hey-owned Leda (LT27) in the field, was the immediate beneficiary of the first corner fracas, inheriting third place.

However she was eventually caught and shuffled back to sixth place by category old hands Russell Greer (Lola T332), Shane Windelburn (Lola T400), and Brett Willis.

Until the final lap that looked like the order the trio was going to cross the finish line in as well – until Brett Willis found a way around both to add a second third race placing to his weekend tally.

New face Tony Annabell (McLaren M10B), meanwhile, who won the second – rolling handicap start - SAS Autoparts MSC NZ F5000 series race of the weekend, earlier in the day, starting off the front of the field and retaining the lead from the start to the finish.

Early on he came under considerable pressure from fellow Class A McLaren driver Frank Karl (McLaren M10B) before Karl slipped back down through the field with a battery issue.

That left Tony Galbraith (Lola T332) in second place with fastest qualifier Michael Collins (Leda GM1) the first of the category front-runners – who started the handicap race from the back of the grid – in a hard-won third place.

Much of the interest in the race was in the position-swapping through the middle of the race, with the starting order based on qualifying positions set on Saturday morning,

Michael Collins again showed his class, however, with both the fastest race lap - a 1:27.742 - and the most positions made -11.

Unfortunately Codie Banks's father David's Talon MR1/A was side-lined on Friday by a broken half shaft and Tony Galbraith was forced to sit out the final race thanks to a brake caliper issue.

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The Taupō Historic GP ran over two-days, 23 and 24 January 2021. As well as races for Formula 5000s, the event featured demonstrations of many historic Ford racing and rally cars, races for Historic Muscle and Saloon Cars, Formula Junior, Historic Sports Racing and other Invited Historic Cars, Historic Formula Fords, Historic Sports Sedans & Allcomers, and TraNZams, plus displays of Ford models spanning 60 years of motoring in New Zealand assembled by members of multiple Ford-Owner clubs from around the country.

The SAS Autoparts, MSC NZ F5000 Tasman Cup Revival Series is organised and run with the support of sponsors SAS Autoparts, MSC, NZ Express Transport, Bonney's Specialised Bulk Transport, Mobil Lubricants, Pacifica, Avon Tyres, Webdesign and Exide Batteries. The series now heads south for its third 2020/21 round at the annual Skope Classic meeting in Christchurch over the Feb 06-07 weekend,

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Newsletter

TCM NZ @ Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park - Taupo, New Zealand - Jan 9th/10th 2021.

I guess it is sort of appropriate for the inaugural TCM NZ event to be held at Taupo, given the kind of cataclysmic nature of the place, and the effect that it has not had only locally, but also on the entire globe, ie from small beginnings come much greater things!

Looking at the beautiful Lake Taupo, in the centre of the North Island, with such tranquillity, it is very easy to forget that one is indeed looking at the water filled caldera of one of the planet's largest, most eruptive, rhyolitic super volcanos. In fact, the super volcano has accounted for the two most violent, volcanic events in the earth's recent geological history. One can take some considerable solace from the fact that the last eruption was some 1800yrs ago (the Hatepe eruption for those playing at home) and the first, the Oruanui eruption a little over 26,500yrs ago. To give you some idea of the order of these events, early Chinese records show that the sky in China was completely dark for many months following the Hatepe event, the central North Island was covered in some 660 feet of ignimbrite ash and pumice. The relatively recent eruption of Krakatoa threw some 2.4 cubic kilometres of material into the air, which as dramatic and climate changing as it was in our lifetime, is all but a non-event compared with Taupo, which threw some 530 cubic kilometres (or 100 cubic miles for those who still prefer miles an hour!) into the air in one horrific bang. Super Volcanos, which fortunately are few in number, eg Yellowstone, pool magma under the surface, with no vents or domes to release the pressure, so simply eventually explode, collapsing into the caldera space left by the violently departed magma. (now filled by water as Lake Taupo). Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park would have been no place to be on the above two occasions, but sadly life at both Pukekohe and Manfeild would not have been any better. By the time you got to the Chatham Islands, some 620 miles to the east of NZ, you are only buried in some 7 inches of pyroclastic pumice and ash, probably still too much for a 4 layer nomex suit. My final comment on the subject, and I am thinking of doing magnetism next time, is that for the advanced class, the Waikato River flowed across the Hauraki Plains prior to the Oruanui eruption, and was moved to its current course through the Waikato, past Hampton Downs, by some pesky volcano, which recidivistly insists on moving the real estate around! Actually, come to that, I wonder on the next go, whether it might like to make a couple of adjustments to the chicane at Taupo ..... or perhaps that is just me!!

So, in a word, Taupo is an extraordinary place, and a very fitting venue for the advent of TCM NZ. What a wonderful event it was, superbly run by the Historic Racing Club (HRC) with over 200 entries and a very sizable crowd. Given the dearth of motor racing over the last season as a result of Covid, enthusiasm levels were running high. Many classes were combined to attract good fields, which they certainly did, with some spectacular racing. A grid of 53 go-carts was some spectacle, and maybe it is just me, but listening to them all sitting on the dummy grid, I just get overwhelmed by that feeling, that they are all about to just go out and cut something (? the grass).

The 8 car TCM NZ field was combined with the Falcon/Commodore 'Super Six' field and a solitary Holden HQ, for a full field of excellent racing. Friday practicing, qualifying on the Saturday morning and then three races over the weekend gave everyone good track time, racing and opportunity. The weather was all versions of hot, with in-car temperatures well into the 50's. Given that Taupo is 1200 feet above sea level, with little cloud cover over the weekend, the sun was fierce.

#### Tyres:

Thank you to Value Tyres and Hankook for coming on board in support of our series with their wonderful C51 Compound, DOT rated, Z14 semi - slick tyre, which has such a wonderful reputation here.

#### Muscle Car Series in NZ:

There are a number of Muscle Car Race Series in New Zealand. The aim is for them all to be complementary to one another, and many of us belong to all, but all of them. TCM NZ occupies an entirely different space to Mainland Muscle Cars, Historic Muscle Cars, Production Muscle Cars, Northern Muscle Cars, and Central Muscle Cars, etc. TCM NZ is a conduit for the Australian TCM Series to be able to come and race here, and for cars from NZ to go and race there. It is to provide an alternative, but non-competing series to the others with careful round selection so that potentially a driver can race in all without conflict.
